

Butterfly Garden Requirements

Sun – at least 6 hours a day



Moisture – but well drained soil



Surrounding shrubs, lawn, rocks


Rock/hard structures



Shelter – bushes, trees, vegetable gardens



Untidiness – allows chrysalis and eggs to develop







Plant Selection



- Variety of plants
- Native, Aliens, Weeds & Trees
- Include flowers different sizes
- Flowers all season
- Old Fashion more open the better



Butterflies prefer plants




- Bright colors red, purple, orange, yellow
- Pollen not as important as nectar
- Wide landing area
- Plant 3 or 5 in grouping




